English

In English, we will be reading 'Meesha Makes Friends' by Tom Percival. We will look closely at the illustrations and make predictions as well as using descriptive language to create a recount of the story. The children will be able to explain what makes a good friend and also describe the qualities they have!

Science

In Science, we will explore 'Our Senses'. We will begin by identifying and naming our body parts. We will then explore our 5 senses of sight, hearing, smell, touch and taste. We will find out which body parts are associated with each sense. Finally, we will think about how our lives would be impacted if we did not have any of our 5 senses.



Mathematics

In Maths we will learn about place value. We will do this by sorting, counting and representing objects. We will compare groups and numbers using language such as equal, more/greater and less/fewer. We will count forwards and backwards as well as writing numbers in numerals and words. We will build upon our knowledge of addition and subtraction by using part whole models, fact families and number bonds.

PSHCE

The Health and Wellbeing topic will help us to explore how to recognise different feelings and we will learn strategies to manage our feelings. We will learn about a well balanced and healthy lifestyle as well as the importance for good personal hygiene.



Computing

This term in computing, we will explore e-Safety. We will begin to understand ways to stay safe online and how to use the internet safely.



Art

We will look at the work of Molly Haslund. We will use different tools to draw using our wrists, elbows, shoulders and hips. We will make observational drawings of shells and showcase our work to our peers.
